FROM THE SENIOR MINISTER

“Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name. For the Lord is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations.” Psalm 100:4-5 (NIV)

I like to begin my day by writing in my journal five things I am thankful for. Starting my day with gratitude is the best way to tune my ears toward hearing from God.





WESTERN KENTUCKY MISSION TRIP

One of the biggest things to impact me on mission trips is the connections between the people. I see this both within the mission team itself and the community that we are going to serve.

First, there is always a strong connection within the mission team. The trip allows for every team member to get to know and grow closer to someone that they didn't know or casually knew from church to form a deeper and more meaningful relationship. I have been very fortunate in this regard; I've met individuals on previous trips that I didn't know and have been able to grow and nurture those relationships to develop some close and dear friends. During this trip, I was able to meet new team members and start new friendships. These connections have grown outside the walls of Mount Carmel where we went from being a Mount Carmel only trip to a Mount Carmel led trip with several individuals and groups from surrounding churches. It was amazing to see a group of eighty-plus people going out every day for a week and working outside in the blistering heat and not complaining about it, but looking forward to the next day to get up and do it again.

Second is the connection to the communities that we go to serve. We get the opportunity and honor to meet and help people who have had tragedy strike them both individually and in their community. We are God's hands and feet in telling them that they are loved and cared for. In a world where disasters are only important in the news until the next tragedy or disaster strikes, it is easy to feel forgotten. The need for help and relief doesn't follow the news cycles. Tim told a story on this trip of how one homeowner was brought to tears when he told her that we'd have a group spruce and clean up her flower garden. This simple act of kindness brought so much joy and hope to the homeowner. When her neighbors saw what the group was doing, several came and asked for help in their own flower gardens. To me, this is a great example of how Mount Carmel was acting as the hands and feet not only to one individual, but to a larger community.

My daughter and I were working on a project and needed some small supplies. We went to the local hardware store to purchase the items needed. When one of the other customers saw our mission team shirts he insisted on paying for the items. He said that we were there blessing his community, including his own daughter, so it was the least that he could do to help. I had to return to that hardware store later in the week and the store owner, and other customers recognized me again by the shirt, and they thanked me again for the work that we were doing for their neighbors.

Every year at the end of the week we all wish that we could have done more. I have said many times that we have accomplished what God wanted us to get done. I am not a runner by any stretch of the imagination, but I think a running analogy works well for these trips. We go to these communities as a team. Some of the team works on projects that can be started and completed in our allotted time there; these are our sprinters and short distance runners. There are others who either start or pick up in the middle of a project to complete their part. Sometimes they are able to complete the project and some they have to leave for a future team. These are the relay racers; they complete their leg of the race and pass the baton on to the next team.

In the end, it doesn't matter if it is a short-term project or a long term one; the most important thing is to show that we are the Church in action by being the hands and feet of Christ.

UKRAINE FOOD PACKING

When I think of the meal packing this past June, I cannot help but think that God's faithful family came to help brothers and sisters in Ukraine with zeal. This event was to kick start our Vacation Bible School, and let me tell you, we had a memorable gathering with this food packing. Hebrews 13:1-3 says, "Keep on loving one another as brothers and sisters...Continue to remember those in prison as if you were together with them in prison, and those who are mistreated as if you yourselves were suffering" (NIV).

I believe we fulfilled this on that sunny Sunday afternoon. Based on our registration, we planned for about 100 volunteers to come and participate. Well, we doubled in numbers because we had about 200 volunteers ready to pack the meals! We had all age groups, from families with young ones, to the high schoolers, young adults, and seniors, all ready to share God's love. We partnered with an organization called Lifeline Christian Mission to pack these meals. Will and Jennifer from Lifeline came to help give instructions and were great to work with. They made sure everyone had something to do - and everyone did it. Not only did we pack meals, but we also wrote messages on the boxes, replenished supplies (when we had them), and even transferred the boxes to the Lifeline Truck. We quickly got the job done.

UKRAINE FOOD PACKING



At one point, we took a “break” from packing meals and Natasha Reimer from Mulberry International Resources (One of our overseas partners) shared with the volunteers some details about the war in Ukraine and its devastations. This was important for all of us to hear, giving us perspective; a perspective that told us that packing these meals was going to help Ukrainian families in a significant way. A meal may not mean a whole lot at first, but when you have been displaced, lost loved ones, and had to flee from your home country a simple meal becomes an enormous gift. Most of us cannot imagine the trauma that others have suffered.

When Reagan Anderson and I stood at the doors to greet the volunteers, they just kept coming! To be honest, it was like an army marching in. Looking back, that moment was remarkable. “Let’s love people well” Toby Mac says in his song “Show Up Choose Love”, “His love never fails”. I hope we accomplished that. Because of the 200+ volunteers that chose to show up and to love their neighbors, we packed 7,344 meals to help feed Ukrainian families.

"For when I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.

Then the righteous will answer him, ‘Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?’

The King will reply, ‘Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.’ "Matthew 25:35-40, NIV

BETHLEHEM LIVING WATER

Jay and Ramola Henry, along with Ernest and Numreta McFarland, strive to help “our fellow Christians become more self-sustaining and better able to contribute to the communities they live in.” The Bethlehem Bible College offers tuition-free full-term college degrees, seminars, workshops, camps, conferences, widow and preschool support, disaster relief, and clean water projects.



CHRIST REACHING ASIA MISSION WORLDWIDE INC

Dr. CY & Patricia Kim established this mission which has provided for the spiritual and physical needs of these countries since 1998. They evangelize through building orphanages, housing for lepers, medical clinics and a school for disabled children. In Bacoor City, the Philippines, The Boat Kids Club provides education, food, and healthcare.



LECCE CHRISTIAN MISSION

Pino Neglia is a native of Lecce, Italy, a town of about 125,000 in the heel of the boot of Italy. The church in Lecce is self-supporting, so Pino’s primary work is leadership development, organizing the annual conference for all the churches in Italy, and producing a Christian magazine to help disciple Italian Christians. He also has a ministry among a large number of immigrants in southeast Italy. This mission has expanded its work to two church plants across the Aegean Sea to Albania.

GLOBAL MISSIONS



LIVING WATER CHRISTIAN CHURCH

Since 2003, Salonique and Holgine Adolphe have been transforming Haiti by applying the Great Commission of Jesus through education. The Christian Biblical Seminary of the Caribbean (CBSC), Living Water Christian School, and Professional and Technique Center of the Caribbean equip Haitians of all ages in job skills and evangelism. An “adopt-a-child” program also factors into the ministry efforts. A farm and medical clinic support basic needs. Living Water Christian Church has grown to three locations.



MULBERRY INTERNATIONAL

Natasha Reimer (US) and Hussein Amanov (Ukrainian Staff) work together to bring hope and healing to at-risk children and families. They provide for the needs of abandoned or neglected babies and toddlers at the state hospitals, counseling for single mothers, support for foster and adoptive families, and care for displaced and at-risk families. They also partner with local churches through training to increase their capacity to minister.



PAKISTANI CHRISTIAN EVANGELICAL SERVICES

Missionaries Dr. Saleem and Naylah Massey serve in Pakistan. In 1989 Pastor Saleem Massey’s ministry vision was “to plant 12 churches, start a Bible school and a hospital.” Some 26 years later, he has planted 16 churches, multiple schools and founded The Good Shepherd Christian Hospital in Kasur, Pakistan, where Christian and Muslim doctors work together. Ground-breaking for an outpatient clinic to complement the hospital took place on Palm Sunday, 2017.



PIONEER BIBLE TRANSLATORS

Gregory & Rondy Ohrenberg have been serving PBT in Vanuatu since 2005. They not only painstakingly translate Scripture into the dialects of the people of Vanuatu, but live among them, ministering through daily life and Bible studies. Out of nearly 7,000 languages spoken in the world today, more than 1,900 have no Scripture— not even a word. PBT predicts that by 2050, there will be Scripture available for every language group on earth.


